The ROS (formerly the National Osteoporosis Society) has invested over £6 million in more than 110 research projects. Responsible for overseeing the charity's <u>Research Grants Programme</u>, the Research and Innovation Grants Assessment Panel (RIGAP) makes recommendations to the Board of Trustees on the allocation of research and innovation funding in line with the charity's four-year strategy <u>Breaking the Silence</u>, which is focused on helping to close the osteoporosis care gap and reduce health inequalities.
